

A little too close for comfort

Koster - P.D.I. Wildlife Rescue co-founder and snake catcher Pieter Kruger had a very close encounter when he was bitten by a snouted cobra on Wednesday 30 March.

He was called out to a farm near Kosterdam to remove the cobra lurking in a bathroom. Even after years of experience with snakes, the cobra managed to outwit him as he was trying to retrieve it. He tried to pull away, but it was too quick and bit him on his right hand. "This is not my first encounter with these snakes, and I have become almost immune to their venom," Kruger said in an interview with



The venom of the snouted cobra is both neurotoxic and cytotoxic and may cause some tissue damage. Luckily Kruger's calm demeanour and quick action only left him with swollen, painful hand for a few days and not any permanent damage.

Knowing exactly what do to in a situation like this also made a big difference so he shared a few tips of what to do if someone accidentally get bitten by a snake: "The most important thing is to remain calm and make sure the victim's airway remains open. Place the wound under running water and ensure that it flows away from

Getting the necessary treatment as soon as possible is very important so call for help. If possible, try to identify the snake, you can look at its markings and the shape of its head. This can help doctors to make sure that they administer the correct antivenom. You can also call the hospital beforehand and tell them the patient is coming so that they start the treatment as soon as you arrive.


He also advised to never cut, squeeze or try to suck out the venom. There are a lot of old wives' tales out there like drinking milk or sucking out the venom. Never cut, squeeze or suck the wound.

If you see a snake in your home, immediately call a snake catcher. Do not try to pick it up or trap it, but keep an eye on it - from a safe distance so that you can tell the catcher exactly where to find it. Snakes are generally shy and will not attack unless provoked. It's best to not violate their territory and let them be. Instead, carefully get everyone including your pets out of the room immediately. Shut the door and fill the gap underneath with a towel.

P.D.I. Wildlife Rescue often gets called out to snakes. They catch the snakes and then release them in more 'snake friendly' areas like open fields away from homes and people. They don't charge for their services but request a donation, so that they can continue their good work that not only includes snakes but other wildlife as well. They also assist in training aspiring game rangers who don't have the necessary funds to study, a service they can only continue with the assistance of the community.





Mbali and Danie saved the day

Rustenburg - Mbali Mahlangu (17) and Anton's Towing Platinum Weekly reached out to the older brother of one as true heroes by ER24 paramedics after they went out of their way to assist victims of a car accident on Saturday 2 April.

Mbali was just hanging out with friends in the complex where she stays when she heard a terrible crash. She was the first one on scene and found two vehicles which collided at the crossing of the R24 and Drakensberg Road. Two people were lying in the ground next to the one car, and without hesitation, she rushed to their aid. "My daughter is not really someone that will do something like that, but God gave her the strength and courage to go and help," Mahlangu's mother Boitumelo Mahlangu said in an interview with Platinum Weekly.

Appelgryn arrived shortly after. "When I arrived on scene and saw the state of the vehicle, I knew the people needed help urgently, so I also called ambulance services. Mbali was sitting with the one of the injured, and I was sitting with the other, encouraging them to stay calm and conscious," Appelgryn said.

Once the ambulances arrived, the injured were loaded in and transported to nearby hospitals.

"These two deserve recondition for what they did. They not only helped; they saved lives. If it wasn't for these two who reacted so quickly, the victims wouldn't have survived," ER24 general manager Marchant Jacobs said.

Beware of rocks in the road

Brits - Two people traveling on the N4 fell victim to Regional manager, South African National Roads armed robbers at around 2am in the morning on Wednesday 29 March. A 69-year-old man and his friend were near the Brits Plaza tollgate when they hit rocks that were placed in the road. They stopped to investigate and were overpowered by six men who robbed them of their cash, two cell phones and a firearm. Rustenburg/ Bokamoso - Police are investigating a case of murder after a suspected robber was assaulted by members of the Bokamoso community and died.



"Fines were issued for non-compliance and for contravention of Section 2(1), Section 11, Section 15, Section 21(1),

Section 21(7), and Section 28(2(b) - failure to register, failure to renew certificates, failure to display certificates, failure to keep proper records, failure to make entries, failure to rectify on demand of SAPS," said police spokesperson captain Elsabe Augoustides.



Department warns against vaccinating animals for foot-and-mouth disease

North West – Following a media statement released by minister Thoko Didiza confirming the outbreak of foot-and-mouth disease in the province, the North West Department of Agriculture and Rural Development also confirmed on 23 March that this outbreak has affected farms in JB Marks Local Municipality (Tlokwe & Ventersdorp).

The affected farms have been placed under quarantine.

On 4 April, another five farms have been quarantined outside Potchefstroom. The conditions of the quarantine are that there will be no movement of animals into, though, and from the affected farms. The objective of the quarantine is to curb and prevent the spread of the disease.

Foot-and-mouth disease is a viral disease that causes blisters and sores in the hooves, mouth, and dental pad of cloven-hoofed animals.

Vaccination for foot-and-mouth disease in South Africa is strictly regulated by the government. Only with approval from the director of Animal Health, the use of vaccines without authorisation can result in vaccinated animals testing positive and being classified as infected resulting in further measures being imposed on the farm.

All vaccines that are used for this purpose need to be registered and authorised for such purpose and as such, they are only in the hands of government officials. In the North West, vaccination of cattle and pigs against footand-mouth disease is not permitted and is therefore illegal. The sale of such vaccines is also illegal.

Says doctor Langa Madyibi: "Farmers are advised to inform any local state veterinary office should they be approached with a sale of foot-and-mouth vaccines that are not registered".

All farmers, livestock owners, members of industry and are urged to use caution when sourcing cattle, ensure that you know the health of the animals you are investing in and where possible, seek a health attestation from the seller's veterinarian confirming the health status of the animals you are buying.

Foot and Mouth Disease is one of the most serious livestock diseases. Humans are only extremely rarely infected by foot-and-mouth disease virus (FMDV).

The livestock foot-and-mouth disease virus is different to that of hand, foot and mouth disease (HFMD), a common infection in children that causes sores called ulcers inside or around their mouth and a rash or blisters on their hands, feet, legs, or buttocks. It can be painful, but it isn't serious (if treated).

Innovative CPR via video call could save your life

Mouth-to-mouth no longer the only way to administer CPR

SA – As a first for Africa, a new digitally enabling life-saving service puts callers phoning from the scene of a medical emergency (via video calling) with trained Netcare 911 emergency healthcare providers to demonstrate and guide them through the cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) technique until paramedics arrive.

Particularly since the start of the Covid-19 pandemic, members of the public may be hesitant to perform mouth-to-mouth resuscitation on anyone other than an immediate family member in an emergency - however this aspect is no longer considered necessary

When a caller reports an emergency requiring CPR to Netcare 911's EOC on 082 911, the coordinator immediately initiates the video calling process by sending the caller a link via SMS which connects to a live secure video

platform. The caller clicks on the link to connect with the Netcare 911 emergency care providers, enabling them to see and hear each other.

"A qualified health provider, a registered nurse or paramedic, then demonstrates the relevant CPR technique to use for an adult, child or an infant on an appropriately sized mannequin representing the patient. All the while, a case manager coaches the caller to copy their actions to perform CPR correctly on the patient at the scene.

"Thanks to the visual element of the two-way video link, the caller can more accurately follow the CPR technique required, while our 'CPR coach' provides informed and detailed feedback to the caller to guide their CPR efforts." says Van Zvl.

"Through this easy-to-use service, we hope more South Africans will gain the confidence to get involved to assist a person in need of life-saving resuscitation. It is less daunting to attempt CPR if you can copy a professional's actions, and all the time the caller is being encouraged and coached through every step to help ensure they are doing it correctly, even if the caller has had no prior training," Ramduth adds. "This can buy precious time to save the heart and brain by keeping the blood supply moving around the patient's body until paramedics are on scene to take over, which can improve outcomes exponentially."

The Netcare 911 live video link telehealth service is provided through the secure Netcare VirtualCare platform, with all data encrypted to protect the caller, ensure patient privacy and protect confidential information. Using the platform does not require an App to be downloaded and is very user friendly, yet secure

Can the employer dismiss an employee for refusing to testify?

The employee was appointed as an assistant administrator in 2012 and was later promoted to human resources admin clerk.

While busy performing her duties, the employee She then rushed in to separate the colleagues, one

As a result of the incident, Mr X was subjected to a disciplinary hearing and subsequently dismissed. The employee was instructed to attend the hearing to testify, and she refused. Mr X then referred the dispute to the CCMA.

The employee was also subjected to a disciplinary hearing and dismissed for disobeying reasonable instruction and leaking confidential information. The employee referred a dispute to the CCMA, alleging that her dismissal was unfair.

At the arbitration hearing, the commissioner ruled a sanction short of dismissal was the appropriate sanction, and he issued a final warning valid for six months.

The employer was not happy with the outcome, and he referred the dispute to the Labour Court. The Labour Court arrived at the same decision which the arbitrator came at but with different reasons. The employer was still not satisfied, and he referred the dispute to the Labour Appeal Court. The Labour Appeal Court noted that both the CCMA and the Labour Court significantly relied on subpoena issuing in circumstances where the employee refused to testify. The court ruled that the

fact that no subpoena was issued does not mean that the employee cannot be disciplined.

The Labour Appeal Court concluded that the employee was guilty of misconduct in the absence of a valid and reasonable explanation. The overheard raised voices in a colleague's office appropriate sanction is dismissal considering that the employee's failure to testify constitutes a allenge to the employer's authority

The appeal was upheld, and the employee was dismissed.







Help Leane get back on her feet

Rustenburg – Leane Cilliers's love for sport started at the young age of eight. She started to excel, especially in netball, athletics and javelin. "I love the action, being outdoors and the feeling of success after a tough game," she said.

Sadly, at the young age of 15, her life and sports career changed forever on Saturday 12 February when she injured her left knee during netball trials.

A magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) showed that her anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) is completely disrupted. Cilliers is now permanently on crutches and if she does not receive the necessary operation, she will never be able to do any sport again and spend the rest of her life on crutches. Her dreams of becoming a veterinarian, biokinetics or doing physiotherapy on animals will have to be placed on hold.

"Not being able to do sports has had a very negative impact on my life. It also put a strain on my social life as I can't hang out with my friends like a normal teenager, I can't go on tours, and I don't feel included anymore. It feels like I am not good enough," Cilliers explained

Her school accommodated her by allowing her to stay in one class, so she does not have to move around.

Once she receives the surgery, she will have to go for another six to eight weeks of rehabilitation, and then after eight months to a year, her life will slowly but surely return to normal.

Her surgery and road to recovery will cost approximately R142 385.51 and without a medical aid these funds have to be raised with the help of the community.

Cilliers's mother Yolanda Joubert has launched various projects to help raise funds, but they still have a very long way to go to get


